

CLUB BY-LAWS

1. For the purpose of these By-laws, only those activities which have been approved by the Committee shall be recognised as OFFICIAL Club activities. Any activity not so approved shall be considered as a member's private activity.
2. All members and visitors shall at all times whilst engaged in Club activities abide by the Club By-laws, Rules, Regulations and Policies.
3. All members shall at all times abide by laws and regulations as laid down by all Government authorities – and shall respect the rights and requirements of the owners of private property.
4. No member shall act in any manner prejudicial to the interests of the Club.
5. Any members who, at any time, identify themselves with the Club either visibly or in any other way whatsoever, shall be bound to comply with these By-laws for the full duration of the time in which such identification may be possible.
6. Members are required to complete all three modules of the Club's driver training course before participating in, and driving off-road in, a Club trip, unless exemption has been applied for and granted by the Committee. It is also a requirement for members that, before being eligible to participate in a Club trip, their membership status must be currently financial.
7. All members and their visitors participating in Club activities shall at all times abide by the direction and instruction of the appointed trip leader or deputies in respect of:
 - a Safety of other members
 - b Route to be taken
 - c Fire precautions and restrictions
 - d Care and respect of private property
 - e Any other instructions issued for a particular activity
8. All members must comply with the current TLCC Safe Work Method Statements, which have been published on the Club's website.
9. Club members are required, for Club trips, to have fitted to their vehicle a UHF Radio with a minimum of 5 Watt transmit power output, for inter-vehicle communication. Handheld UHF radios may be used as supplementary short range communication but are unsuitable for inter-vehicle communication. Trip leaders may apply discretion to the above as they see fit.
10. Firearms, and prohibited weapons of all kinds, are not permitted to be used or displayed on a Club activity.
11. Carrying and use of explosives, meaning "pyrotechnics" is forbidden on any Club outing, reconnaissance or activity.
12. Intoxicating liquor must not be consumed by the passengers or driver of any vehicles during the driving portion of any Club activity. Alcohol may be consumed in moderation during meal breaks.
13. Members must ensure that there is no rubbish left at any stopping place. All rubbish must be removed from all activity areas and be disposed of in the correct manner. What you take in, you take out! All fires must be properly extinguished prior to departure from stopping places and campsites.

Note: By-laws may be varied by the Committee in special circumstances.
